From The President

As you might have heard by now, Dave Strauser has resigned from the LCC Board and as President of the Club. We would like to thank Dave for his years of service on the Board and his service as President since this May. The bylaws of Ligonier Country Club direct that in the event of a vacancy, the Vice-President of the Board should serve as President until the next Election, which will be in May of 2020. I will attempt to fill that role going forward, realizing that, as a Club, we have much to do to improve our golf course so that we can adapt to a changing environment and to be better prepared for changing weather patterns.

The Board realizes that course conditions over the past two years have not been satisfactory to the membership, and we are taking steps to ensure that the course (and particularly the greens) are the best that they can be. We need to be better prepared for extended rainy and/or hot conditions and to be more proactive rather than reactive in our approach. That will require additional investment in our golf course, both in people and in course improvements.

By far the most immediate need that we have is to find a way to remove rainfall from our greens. We have looked at several solutions, from re-building the greens to USGA specifications (totally unaffordable and not sure it is necessary), to equipping the affected greens with internal drainage systems. We have decided and have committed to installing the XJD system in 6 of our most affected greens before the 2020 golf season, and to rebuilding and re-contouring Number 3 (old 12) entirely. The cost for this work will be in excess of \$120,000, and we have begun a fundraising campaign to fund all or part of this project. We hope you will consider supporting this project, which we think will go a long way in improving the playability of our golf course.

Despite the additional expense to improve drainage on these greens, the Board has committed to no annual dues increase for 2020.

We also intend to better communicate our plans to the golf membership, and to do that, we will be scheduling a general golf membership meeting in the near future. Please be on the lookout for that notice and plan to participate. In the meantime, there are still some beautiful golf days yet to be and we encourage you to support your club by playing golf at Ligonier Country Club during the Fall season.
